





# A GLIMPSE OF MORAN MAHILA MAHAVIDYALAYA

#### INTRODUCTION

Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya was established on July 8, 1992, with a noble purpose to cater to the educational aspirations of the region's socially disadvantaged female population. This premier institute of higher education is the outcome of the pioneering efforts of 'Ratnagarbha' Dr. SukhaBaruah (Founder Principal). Nestled in the predominantly rural enclave of Moran in the historic Charaideo district, the erstwhile capital of the illustrious Ahom Kingdom, the institution has stood as an enduring beacon of enlightenment and empowerment since its inception. The college is dedicated to the upliftment of higher education for young women from the surrounding ethnic and linguistic backgrounds, as well as from every nook and cranny of the region and nearby districts and states.

The college holds affiliation with Dibrugarh University and garnered recognition under sections 2(f) and 12(B) of the UGC Act on January 29, 1999, and February 4, 2010, respectively. On January 1, 2013, the institution was provincialized by the Government of Assam under the Provincialisation of Services Act, 2011, securing sustainable support and integration into the state's educational framework. Underscoring its steadfast dedication to high standards of education and social values, the college achieved NAAC 'B' accreditation (CGPA 2.34) in 2021. This accreditation not only affirms the quality of instruction but also the holistic development provided by the college.

#### **Academic Aspect**

Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya is dedicated to providing quality higher education to female students through its diverse and robust teaching departments. At present, the college offers a range of Honours programs in disciplines such as Assamese, English, Economics, Education, History, Political Science, and Sociology. Additionally, the college is going to open Geography Honours very shortly. Besides, Community Science is available as a non-Honours subject at the degree level. The college provides academic flexibility to students by offering various Skill Enhancement Courses (Add-on Courses) which include Yoga, Computer (DTP), Beautician, Clothing construction (Knitting, Cutting, and Embroidery), Gymnasium (Weight Lifting/Powerlifting), Communicative English etc. The institution has also embarked on various educational initiatives under the aegis of Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU), thereby broadening its academic offerings and reinforcing its commitment to comprehensive vis-a-vis inclusive education.

Through these comprehensive offerings, the library of Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya continues to play a pivotal role in supporting the academic and intellectual pursuits of its community, upholding its mission to provide an environment that promotes learning and knowledge enhancement.

#### Admission Procedure

The admission process at Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya is conducted through a single online portal called Assam State Higher Education Admission Portal **Samarth eGov** (UG programmes) from the Academic Session 2024-25 under the Department of Higher Education Assam. It provides a common platform and equal opportunities to candidates across the state, especially those from rural and other remote areas and help establish better connect with the Universities and colleges. In addition to UG admission, there is also a common online admission portal for senior secondary called **DARPAN**, under AHSEC, which is followed at Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya.

#### **Admission Fees**

The exact admission fees is confirmed at the time of the Admission as per Government guidelines.

#### Hostel Facility and Admission

The college has a three-storied RCC hostel building within the campus with 130 seat capacity, furnished with all essential amenities required by students. Hostel admission is granted on merit basis. Sixty percent of the available seats are reserved for degree-level students, while forty percent are allocated to HS level students. Following admission, residents must adhere to all hostel rules and regulations set forth by the college authority. These rules and regulations are communicated immediately after hostel admission.

**Hostel Admission Fees:** Admission fees is confirmed at the time of the Hostel Admission Notification.

#### **College Rules & Regulations**

- 1. Wearing the prescribed uniform is mandatory.
- 2. Students must carry their identity cards at all times.
- 3. The college gate remains closed from 10:00 am to 2:30 pm.
- 4. The use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited within the college premises.
- 5. A minimum of 80% attendance is compulsory.
- 6. Participation in all social functions, including college week, is mandatory for students.

#### College Uniform

The prescribed college uniform consists of a white Mekhela, white Chadar with a navy blue border, and a navy blue blouse, or a white plain kurta up to knee length with a navy blue border at the sleeves, white simple pyjamas, and a navy blue dupatta. During the winter season, only navy blue sweaters or blazers are permitted. Students are not allowed to enter the college premises without wearing the full uniform.

Its study centre was initiated here (Moran Mahila Mahavidyalaya) in May, 2012 with 48 students in the first batch (Degree 1st sem.) Next year, the enrolment rose upto 51 thereby making us fortunate enough to reach the level of 4th Sem. Another achievement to note is that we have already started BPP (Bachelor Preparatory Programme) so that all the undermatric individuals and disadvantaged groups can grab the opportunity for higher education. In this case we got 73 students in the first batch, and now the admission for the present session is going on.
